The U.S. Capitol Visitor's Center & Outdoor Tour of the Capitol Grounds

Tours and entry to the Capitol are free, though reservations are recommended. The Capitol Visitor Center is open Monday-Saturday from 8:30am - 4:30pm.

Outdoor tours of the Capitol Grounds are a specialty and are 50 minutes long. No passes are required.

Built to commemorate first U.S. President George Washington

Memorializes those who served in the Korean War

Located at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue NW in Washington, D.C., it has served as the residence of every U.S. president since John Adams in 1800 when the national capital was moved from Philadelphia.
