# MODERATOR - WILLIAM J. ANTHOLIS

William J. Antholis is the Director and CEO of the Miller Center for Public Affairs at the University of Virginia. Previously, he was Managing Director at the Brookings Institution, where he guided policy research initiatives and co-authored books including Fast Forward: Ethics and Politics in the Age of Global Warming and Inside Out India and China: Local Politics Go Global. His early career included roles in the White House National Security and Economic Councils, and the State Department, particularly on climate and international economic affairs. He earned his BA from the University of Virginia and a PhD in Politics from Yale University.





## DR. NICHOLAS G. BOURBAKIS

Nikolaos G. Bourbakis is a Greek computer scientist and professor, currently serving as an Ohio Board of Regents Distinguished Professor of Information Technology at Wright State University, where he also directs both the Information Technology Research Institute and the Assistive Technologies Research Center. His expertise lies in image processing, autonomous robotic vision, and assistive technology, and he is the founder and editor-in-chief of the International Journal on Artificial Intelligence Tools. He earned his mathematics degree from the University of Athens and his PhD in computer engineering and informatics from the University of Patras in 1983 and has been honored with the IEEE Computer Society Technical Achievement Award for his pioneering contributions.



# **NIOVI CHRISTOPOULOU**

Niovi Christopoulou is an attorney with a multi-jurisdictional presence in New York, Washington, D.C., and Athens, serving formerly as global legal lead in Amazon's Payments group. She holds an LL.M and JD (Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar) from Columbia University School of Law, and her practice spans mergers & acquisitions, private equity, fintech, digital assets, AI policy, and complex partnership arrangements. She is currently a venture partner at NextGen Venture Partners, advises on AI-driven product and policy development, serves as a mentor in entrepreneurship accelerators, and previously was Assistant General Counsel at Libra Capital. In 2024, she was the first U.S.-based candidate to stand for election to the European Parliament with New Democracy where she championed issues affecting the Greek diaspora.



### **ALEXANDROS G. DIMAKIS**

Alexandros G. Dimakis is a professor in the Department of Electrical Engineering & Computer Sciences at UC Berkeley. He earned his PhD from UC Berkeley and a Diploma in Electrical and Computer Engineering from the National Technical University of Athens. His research—spanning generative models, information theory, and distributed coding and learning—has appeared in over 150 publications. He has received several prestigious awards, including the NSF CAREER, Google Research Award, and the IEEE James L. Massey Award, and serves in editorial and reviewer roles for top ML conferences and journals.





### PARIS KARASSO

Paris Karasso is a Senior Advisor at Calamos Wealth Management, providing comprehensive investment and wealth advisory services to high-net-worth clients and institutions. Previously, he served as Chief Investment Officer and General Manager at Alpha Asset Management and Eurobank Asset Management. He started his career on Wall Street as a quantitative strategist and proprietary trader in fixed-income desks at firms including Bear Stearns, Deutsche Bank, and Bankers Trust. Paris holds both a Master's degree and a PhD in Mechanical Engineering from Stanford University and serves on the Board of the American College in Greece.



### **KOSTAS KOEMAN**

Kostas Koeman founded the Hellenic Archaeological Exploration Society in 2022 to support academic research and non-profit institutions in fulfilling their missions through cutting edge technology. He participated in the Mentor Shipwreck Excavation Program in 2023 and produced a film about the program's history and aspirations for the future that is available online and portions will be displayed at the underwater archaeological museum under construction in Piraeus, Greece. He has ongoing projects assisting non-profit foundations in the Pacific Northwest and will be expanding support of historians and archaeologists in Greece in the coming year.



#### Dr. Nicholas Theodore

Nicholas Theodore, MD, is an award-winning professor researcher who joins the University of Arizona's College of Medicine as Chair of the Department of Neurosurgery at Baner-University Medical Center. He was the Director of Johns Hopkins University Neurosurgical Spine Program and Co-leader of the Carnegie Center for Surgical Innovation at Johns Hopkins. He specializes in spinal trauma, minimally invasive and robotic spine surgery, spinal cord injury treatment, and personalized medicine, and has authored hundreds of publications.

Dr. Theodore completed his MD at Georgetown University, neurosurgery residency and spinal fellowship at Barrow Neurological Institute, and has held distinguished faculty and leadership roles, including as the Donlin M. Long Professor of Neurosurgery. He is attributed with 400+ journal papers and has received substantial grants from NIH, DARPA and other sources. Dr. Theodore served our nation as a neurosurgeon in the United States Navy.





# JAMES CHARLES THEOFILOS

James Theofilos is a business and finance leader with deep expertise at the intersection of AI and cloud technology. Most recently, he served as Senior Finance Manager for Azure & AI at Microsoft, where he was the Go-to-Market Finance Lead for AI Apps & Agents, including Azure OpenAI, AI Foundry, and GitHub Copilot. Over his six years at Microsoft, James drove strategy across healthcare, financial services, telecom, and enterprise solutions—shaping investments, P&L performance, and go-to-market initiatives that accelerated AI adoption at scale. James is now joining Google Cloud as the Go-to-Market Lead for AI Infrastructure, where he will help build the ecosystem and compute capacity required to support Google's most strategic AI customers.

James also serves on the Board of Directors at electroCore, Inc., a medical technology company pioneering innovation to improve patient outcomes.
